



Who and what is „imdialog! e.V.“ ?*

In 2002 Werner Bab, a Holocaust survivor, and Christian Ender met in the Jewish Museum in Berlin. This spontaneous meeting soon led to the general question of what a citizen could do against right-wing radicalism, against the denial concerning the Holocaust and toward the promotion of human rights and international understanding on a social level. In order to augment this discussion, Werner Bab wanted to come in contact with schools to give students a firsthand account as a witness of the Holocaust and warn against the consequences of totalitarian regimes. The idea to make a documentary as an introduction to the discussions with a contemporary witness of the Holocaust resulted in the DVD Production “Time Intervals” (Zeitabschnitte), which is now available with subtitles in nineteen languages (Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Greek, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Dutch, Persian, Portuguese, Polish, Russian, Spanish, Czech, Hungarian, Turkish und German). As a result there is now the opportunity to reach many interested people – including the international community. In 2005, the first conversations combined with the presentation of the documentary “Time intervals” (“Zeitabschnitte”) started. The concept is to make a free copy of the DVD available to each interested participant. We hope that by distributing the DVD we can encourage a continuing discussion of its content, with the result that even after the talks have finished, the issues will be remembered on a long-term basis. Particularly after the presentations in classrooms, we hope that with our concept we can reach out to people and generations which normally are shut off from any contact with this sort of memoir. Additionally, the guest book on our homepage offers a forum for thoughts and questions as well as other personal remarks including comments concerning the entries of other visitors. We are looking forward to your feedback!

What we have achieved so far.

In addition to the above mentioned discussions, which took place in different locations such as the Jewish Museum Berlin, Humboldt University in Berlin, St. Michaels Church in Göttingen, Yale University, the Goethe Institute in Santiago, Chile, the Museum of Tolerance, New York, USA as well as schools in Göttingen and Berlin, the documentary was aired on various German TV-Channels such as XXP, FAB, ZDF-Dokukanal and PHOENIX. An interview was also aired by SPIEGEL TV on May 3, 2005. Several archives such as the Holocaust Center of Northern California, San Francisco, Simon

Wiesenthal Center in Los Angeles, Yad Vashem, Jerusalem and the Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington have included the DVD "Time Intervals" (Zeitabschnitte) in their collection. We are especially proud that the Visual Center in Yad Vashem features the DVD "Time Intervals" (Zeitabschnitte).



Time Intervals of Werner Bab (Zeitabschnitte des Werner Bab)

Werner Bab was born October 2, 1924 in Oberhausen. Since 1929 he has lived in Berlin. As a consequence of the race-laws legislated in Nürnberg in 1935 and other restrictive laws, made the visit of public schools no longer permissible to him as a German Jew, he was forced to visit a boarding school for Jewish children in Stettin after a short stay in Schneidemühl.

After the imprisonment of all the teachers and the closing of the school after The Night of Broken Glass in November 1938, Werner Bab returned to Berlin.

After a failed escape in 1942 (he wanted to escape the threat of his deportation) he was arrested by the "Gestapo" at the Swiss border. In the following months he was sent to the concentration camp Auschwitz.

Only a small minority of Jewish fellow-citizens were able to survive the consequences of the national socialist reign of terror which consisted of forced labour, destruction of family-bonds, deportation and finally by the Holocaust.

Very few people exceptionally survived Auschwitz. Although Werner Bab was selected for "the special treatment", execution by gas, he survived.

This film gives insight in the living conditions of Jewish citizens since the beginning of the Second World War and the everyday life in the concentration camps, such as in the Main camp of Auschwitz.

Unfortunately the biographies of Werner Bab cannot be seen as a paradigm: Only a minority could experience the end of the war and could be taken care of in the Displaced-Person-camps.
